

Environmental Concerns

The 2010 catastrophe began when a BP offshore oil rig exploded and sank in the Gulf of Mexico. As much as 5,000 barrels of oil a day were pouring into the sea. Experts believe it is on its way to becoming the worst oil spill in U.S. history. The oil slick grew to the size of Jamaica and started washing up on beaches in Louisiana.

At 4.9 million barrels, that means that the total fine could be \$5.4 billion — and, if gross negligence led to the spill, \$21 billion.

Garbage

A recent discovery shows the world now has two ocean garbage patches. These are huge areas of the ocean which have a huge floating island of trash and litter. The first garbage patch was discovered in the Pacific by ocean researcher Charles Moore in 1997. The new one was found in the Atlantic by a husband and wife team Anna Cummins and Marcus Eriksen.

Tons of plastic is washing up on the beaches of Hawaii. BBC's presenter Simon Reeve says Kamilo Beach on the island of Hawaii has been described as "the world's dirtiest beach". He went on a tour of the remote beach with a local conservationist. They analyzed what was on the beach and found more plastic particles than grains of sand.
